# Too+Adjective

We often use too+adjective to say something is more than we want or need.

The dog is too big.

- Too goes before the adjective.
  We're too tired to walk
- We can use to+infinitive after too+adjective.
  It's too cold to swim.

# (not) Adjective+enough

 My sister can take my dad's car. She's old enough to drive.
 Can you write the date on the board? I'm not tall enough to write at the top
 We often use (not) adjective + enough to say something is less than we want or need.
 I'm not old enough to see that film.

*Enough* goes after the *adjective*. It is not cold enough to wear a jacket.

We can use to + infinitive after (not) adjective enough. It is not warm enough to wear shorts.



hot - cold - late - small - old - young
