WILL V/S BE GOING TO

Use:

WILL

Rapid Decision

- I'm thirsty. I think I will buy a drink.

Offer

- That looks heavy. I will help you with it.

Promise

Don't worry, I won't tell anyone.

Threat

If you don't stop, I will tell your mother.

Refusal

won't = will not

She won't listen to anything I say.

GOING TO

Prior Plan

- = The decision was made before the moment of speaking.
- I'm going to the beach next weekend with my friends.

Evidence / Signs

- = When there are signs that something is likely to happen.
- My stomach hurts a lot and I think I **am going to** throw up.
- It's 70-0. They're going to win.

You can use both **Will** and **Going to** for making predictions.

I think it will rain tomorrow.
 I think it is going to rain tomorrow.

COMPARE: Are you busy this evening?

I haven't made any plans.
 I think I will probably watch TV.
 I'm probably going to watch TV.

Will and **going to** are both possible here. We are "predicting" what will happen because nothing is planned.

Yes, I'm going to the movies.

Only **Going to** is possible because this is a prior plan.

In spoken English **Going to** is often pronounced as "**gonna**"
